For instance, if someone calls into your net and asks for a signal report, GIVE IT TO HIM. It takes a few seconds of your time and makes a friend for the Corps. A comment such as Fine Business signal old man, your 5x9 here at Camp Swampy would you care to join our mid-day traffic net? Nine times out of ten the station will thank you, apologize for breaking the net and QSY. He'll have only good thoughts about the Corps when he leaves. A comment such as "YOU JERK, WHAT KIND OF LID ARE YOU ANYWAY, CAN'T YOU HEAR US PASSING TRAFFIC ON THE MID-DAY NET. GET A RECEIVER." Then they go on to tell how the station is all business etc, etc, etc. By this time you could have passed half dozen pieces of traffic. YOU DON'T OWN THE FREQ any more than the quy who blundered into you, OPNAVS point out very critically that AmRad stations located on board Navy or Marine Corps posts or stations are to participate in ALL PHASES of AmRad activity and to avoid constant harping on the traffic handling to the exclusion of all else. Don't forget mister, you represent the CG or CO of your post and as such you should Act as though he were looking over your shoulder each and every transmission. Also keep in mind that most of your SSB stations have a voice that can be monitored by ANYONE IN THE WORLD. If you feel that you can't control your temper and that you must vent your spleen, then by all means secure your MarCorps rig, go on to your own rig and call and bellow like crazy if you must. You can draw the ire of the WOUF-HONG to your own call and not to the Corps club station.

And while we are at it the phrase "A CLEAR CHANNEL FOR MILITARY PHONE PATCHES WOULD BE APPRECIATED" is one that is bound to get you QRMed right off the band. The phrase implies that you have some special prerogatives, WHICH YOU DO NOT. Most operators will gladly steer clear of a patch, but let's face it, when you run a patch between cities just a stones throw apart then you are really asking for grief. Phone rates are plenty cheap as it is and most of the gab that takes place on these short patches are ridiculous.
